### Right to life (?)

Article 2 – Right to life
Everyone's right to life shall be protected by law.

- Right to food and water
- Not helping with eating

# Right to food and water Not helping with eating

Residents being hurried, food being "shoveled" by staff helping residents to eat.

On some occasions, nursing home staff had not devoted any time to helping residents eat. The meal would be collected again without the food having been eaten.

# Prohibition of inhuman or degrading treatment

Article 3 – Prohibition of torture

No one shall be subjected to
torture or to inhuman or
degrading treatment or
punishment.

- Not (promptly) responding to continence needs
- Failure to provide personal care people left in soil
- Psychological abuse offenses and humiliation
- Physical abuse rude manual handling, hitting, slapping

#### Continence needs

Residents are not taken to use the toilet other than at set "toileting" times and that requests for help often go unanswered.

At times due to staffing pressures residents are

asked to use incontinence pads even though, with some assistance, they are able to use the toilet themselves.

This experience impacts on a person's physical and moral integrity and can have adverse psychological effects.

### People left in wet or soil

Due to time pressure or lack of staff, residents are left for quite a long time wet or soiled or other personal hygiene needs are not met.

#### Offenses or humiliations & physical abuse

Older persons were kicked, slapped, bitten, insulted, forced to eat on the floor has a punishment when they left food falling.

# Prohibition of inhuman or degrading treatment

Article 5 – Right to liberty and security'

Everyone has the right to liberty and security of person. No one shall be deprived of his liberty.

Abuse of physical and chemical restraints

### Abuse of physical and chemical restraints

Wheelchairs tied to balustrades to prevent them from flipping over.
Use of belts to tie the older person to the bed.

Older persons locked in their rooms for "punishment".
